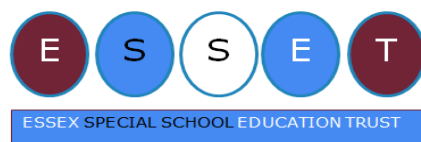


Aspiring Leaders for Special Education

The module explores the leadership issues associated with:

- Involving/engaging key stakeholders
- The importance of listening and using intuition to pre-empt potential problems
 - Parental engagement and pupil participation
- Getting the job done – initiating, implementing and embedding change
 - Working with governors
- Effective networking – working with the community and outside agencies
 - Responsiveness and flexibility in leadership
 - Developing resilience and emotional intelligence

The four ESSET modules:

- Data and assessment
- Teaching and learning
- Leading, managing and supporting a diverse team
 - **Partnerships and the community**

The modules address key leadership challenges for aspiring leaders with an interest in pursuing a career in special education and are designed and delivered by experienced Special School Headteachers. They can be completed in any order.

The development of an on-going professional portfolio is a requirement of the course. All delegates will also be expected to complete assessment tasks, guided activities and additional reading on key topics and pertinent theoretical models. Additional guidance and support is provided. Accreditation at Level 7 is available for those who wish to pursue a full Masters Degree – MA Leadership in Education (University of East London)
